TAKE THE CHALLENGE



Dangers can be all around us. Knowing how to avoid accidents is important. How are people kept safe at events, school, home, farms, and everywhere else? Ready for a challenge? You are about to check your surroundings and spot how risks are being managed.

Learning intention

To raise awareness of

- Potential risks in the environment
- To understand how risks are controlled

Success criteria

Individuals can

- Identify and become familiar with risks and controlling risks around them

Instructions

Take a moment to observe your environment. Use the checklist to assess the safety measures for you and others. Check off any potential risk areas you identify.



Checklist

- Are you familiar with the **AUSTRALIAN YOUNG FARMER CHALLENGE**? Explore its details (using the QR code on the front), engage in conversation with a participant, and observe an event to delve into how this program is actively promoting awareness and educating young Australians (as well as spectators) about keeping safe.
- Are there nearby **ANIMALS**? Explore the measures in place to ensure the safety of the animals, their handlers, and yourself.
- Can you identify any precautions aimed at preventing **DISEASE TRANSMISSION** between animals and humans? What steps can you take to ensure your safety while handling animals?
- Can you observe any instances of **CHEMICAL** usage? How are organisers implementing safety protocols to safeguard the well-being of attendees?
- Search for an area where proper **ELECTRICAL SAFETY** practices are ensuring people's protection. Point this safety feature out to a friend.
- Take a moment to observe the **MACHINERY** in your vicinity. Consider and identify two key safety features integrated into the machinery.
- Continued and long-term exposure to **NOISE** can cause irreparable hearing damage. Install a sound measurement app, and use it to record the decibel levels in your environment.
- Recall that Triple Zero (000) is Australia's main **EMERGENCY** service number. You should call **000** if you need urgent help from police, fire, or ambulance services. Watch the video link below and learn about the app what3words.
